To establish the importance of scientific and technological activities and to promote it's practical learning with outcomes among young minds and for over all development of the states and union territories, thereby for the overall socio-economic India's Department of Science & Technology (DST) initiated a scheme called "Assistance for Development of State Council for Science & Technology" during the Sixth Five Year Plan. Its main objectives were to assist the states and union territories to set up State Councils for Science & Technology to act as focal forums to formulate, plan, coordinate, and promote scientific and technological activities within their respective states .Ever since , the DST has performed a catalytic role in sensitizing almost and has helped establish state Science & Technology councils. Accordingly, the Government of Arunachal Pradesh considered the necessity to set up ,one such organization to identify the areas in which science & technology could be applied for the development of the state, in particular, to tap and amplify proper utilization of natural resources through perspective planning for rural development and improvement

of the socio-economic status of the state. In order to promote scientific and technological services in the state, the Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science and Technology (APSCS&T) was established in 1992 as an autonomous organization under the State Government's Department of Education and registered under the Societies Registration Act,1860 (Extension to Arunachal Pradesh, 1978). Later it was brought under the Department of Science and Technology, Government of Arunachal Pradesh in1998 with the prime objective of augmenting and popularizing the application of science and technology to address local issues for developmental purposes in various areas. The APSCS&T is also the nodal agency for the implementation of the program of the Government of India's Department of Science & Technology. It's administration and management are conducted by its Executive Committee comprising of a Chairperson, Secretary, and Commissioners to the State Government. Its daily affairs and administration are looked after by the Chief Executive, i.e., Director/ Member Secretary. The Department of Science and planned strategy, so as to bring about a sustainable development in the state.

OBJECTIVES OF APSCS&T

- To indicate optimum development of untapped new and renewable sources of energy in Arunachal Pradesh by applying contemporary scientific research and appropriate technology.
- 2. To plan various, Research and Developmental Programmes for academic research and development in existing institutions of the state.
- 3. To assist the State Government in developing suitable Scientific & Technological structures, to ensure and promote the application of proper scientific methods and technology in rural areas that would assist the administration in all matters relevant to application of science and Technology in the regional development and preparation of perspective planning.
- 4. To liaise with national organizations in facilitating, collaboration and transfer of scientific and technological know-how.
- 5. To recommend means of popularizing the use of Science and Technology amongst the people of the State and utilization of mass media, participation and organization of seminars, exhibitions and other such related activities and also development of Application centers, Museums etc.
- 6. To evolve a long term Science & Technology policy and programme with regards to the natural resources/geographical features and socio-economic conditions prevalent in the state.
- 7. To ensure that Science & Technology is harnessed meaningfully for the development of the state.
- 8. To set up a strong and workable mechanism for the transfer of indigenous technology
- 9. To identify projects and programmes to improve the conditions of the rural population and improve the quality of the health and hygiene.
- 10. To promote various Developmental schemes and fully involve and connect the various Departments and the community for the same.
- 11. To promote all activities, conducive to the attainment of the objectives of the society.

Arunachal Pradesh Science Centre was established and was inaugurated on 3rd December 2005, by the then Chief Minister, Shri Gegong Apang at the Indira Gandhi Park in Itanagar. Since its establishment, it has become a center for exhibitions and expositions that explore the knowledge unknown.

DEVELOPMENTAL ACTIVITIES DURING 2018-19

IN ARUNACHAL PRADESH BY APSCS&T

A. SCIENCE POPULARISATION PROGRAMME

The regular programme of the council which involves students and teachers includes: Organising National Children's Science Congress, National Science Day and National Mathematics Day covering all the educational institutions (Govt. Pvt. & NGO run) of the state. The Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science and Technology has been encouraging students to take part in various science activities organised by the council from time to time.

1. DISTRICT & STATE LEVEL NCSC-2018

In Arunachal Pradesh ,The National Children's Science Congress 2018, was initiated from the month of June 2018 under the active initiation of Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology (APSCS&T), Itanagar in co-ordination with the Deputy Director of School Education, Department of Education Govt. of Arunachal .It was organized, both at the Districts and State level as per the directives, and guidelines issued by the National Council for Science and Technology Communication (NCSTC), Dept. of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi. The activities of CSC-2018 continued in the state for over a period of 120 days. The District level activities of CSC 2018 were organized and conducted successfully by the district coordinator in collaboration with Department of Education in all the 23 districts (including capital complex region) in the State.

At the District(s) level CSC 2018, children in the age group of 10-17 years of age from Middle, Secondary and Higher secondary schools (both government and private) schools participated in groups comprising of 2 members with their projects based on the selected sub-themes prepared under the guidance of their

guide teachers. The district level CSC-2018 activities culminated on 31st October, 2018. The selected child scientist from the districts took part in the state level CSC conducted at Itanagar during the month of November.

During the District(s) level Children's Science congress - 2018, One hundred fifty (150) projects were presented with participation of one hundred and five (105) schools (Government and private) from all the twenty three (23) districts of the state. . There was participation of 300 child scientist of which 129 were male and 171 were female child scientists respectively. Age wise two hundred thirty six (236) were from the upper age group (15 – 17 years) and sixty four (64) were from, the lower age group (10 -14 years). Area wise one hundred eighteen (118) were from urban and one hundred and eighty two(182) were from rural sectors respectively.

The State level Children's Science Congress-2018 was organized and conducted during November 16th& 17th 2018 at Arunachal Pradesh Science Centre, Indira Gandhi Park, Itanagar. Shri Bamang Mangha, Chairman, Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology, Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh and also the Chief Guest for the function inaugurated the State

officials and officers of Arunachal Pradesh Science Centre and Department of Bio-Technology. School children's from the nearby schools of capital complex also took part and witnessed the two days long programme.

The group leaders of the best three (3) projects at the District(s) Level who were adjudged, first, second and third), accompanied by their escort teachers participated in the two days long programme. The programme was supported by National Council for Science and Technology Communication (NCSTC), Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, New Delhi. Gracing the occasion as Chief Guest, Shri Bamang Mangha, Chairman, APSCS&T, appreciated the children's enthusiastic participation and stated that the Department of Science and technology is the nodal agency which is serving as a great platform for the students even from the remotest areas to showcase their talent, creativity and innovative ideas to the world.

At the two days long State level Children's Science Congress 2018 a total number of fifty two (52) projects were presented by child scientists covering all the five sub-themes under the selected focal theme of the 26th National Children's Science Congress. The Theme was "Science, Technology & Innovation for

A Clean, Green & Healthy Nation". Out of the fifty two (52) projects presented and scrutinized ten (10) projects were selected by the judges. The projects were evaluated by a panel of evaluators comprising of Dr. Awadhesh Kumar, faculty from Department of Forestry, Dr. A. Dhinamani Singh, Department of CEC from North Eastern Regional and Dr. Swapna Acharjee, Scientist from State Remote Sensing Application Centre, Itanagar in order of their merit and relevance to the focal theme. The selected teams represented Arunachal Pradesh at the 26thNational Children's Science Congress 2018 held at Shksha O Anusandhan University, Bhubaneswar (Odisha), during December 27-31, 2018.


In his Inaugural address Dr. Ahmed, elaborated the importance of mathematics in day to day life and urged the teachers and students to study and teach

The main programme was held at Arunachal Pradesh science centre on 28th February 2018.

4. SCI-CONNECT NORTH EAST

"Sci-Connect" Connecting Young Talents with science, is a First of its kind Program designed and initiated by the Vigyan Prasar (An autonomous organisation under the Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India) especially for children I the North-Eastern States of India, i.e., Assam, Mizoram, Nagaland, Tripura, Manipur, Sikkim, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh with the objective to nurture the Scientific aptitude and attitude of the 'Young Talents' of North-east and sensitise young children in upper primary to secondary levels about science in daily life. The programme was initiated by Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology (APSCS&T), Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, since 2017.

On July 10, 2018 under the initiative of APSCS&T a Screening Test of 886 candidates was done to select 30 students from Arunachal Pradesh for the Regional Level Quiz Competition. Out of the 30 selected and qualified in the state level screen test examination 15 students were selected to participate in the Regional Level competition centrally organised by Vigyan Prasar and Mizoram Council of Science and Technology held at Mizoram University on 28th-30th August 2018.

5. EXPOSURE TOUR FOR MERITORIOUS STUDENTS OF ARUNACHAL PRADESH



Science is the curiosity to know or understand about certain things and technology is the outcome of that curiosity. It is very important to inculcate the importance of science & technology among the younger generations and enable them to understand the various aspects of science & technology. The children will be able to understand and take interest in science & technology if they are given the opportunity and environment for experiential learning. Theory based education alone is not enough to inculcate love for Science among students. Students need to have a more practical approach and clear concepts for understanding science. Exposure visits pose a very helpful and useful way to learn Science.

Arunachal Pradesh State Council of Science & Technology arranged exposure tour for meritorious students. A group comprising of ten (10) students were led and escorted by Dr P akngu Lombi, Scientist-`B` & Deputy Director (Technical), A. P. State Council for Science & Technology, Itanagar along with three teachers to Bengaluru .The programme was w.e.f 17th -23rd July 2018. The team visited Indian Institute of Science, IISc, Bangaluru.. During the programme the students had the opportunity to visi and interact with the scientists of important centres like ISRO–Exhibition Centre, Heritage Centre & Aerospace Museum, Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd and, Indian Institute of Science. They also visited places like Lalbagh-Botanical Garden, Jawaharlal Nehru Planetarium, Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum (VITM), Metro Station and Karnataka Vidhan Saudha (Sabha) etc. around Bengaluru city.

6. WIPRO-EARTHIAN PROGRAMME FOR SCHOOLS IN ARUNACHAL PRADESH



Wipro **'Earthian'** programme came into being in 2011, with the conviction that building awareness is the first step towards sustainability. The vision of Wipro Earthian is rooted in the challenging task that the humanity faces - of finding solutions to several sustainability issues like climate change, water scarcity and loss of biodiversity amongst several others. The project aims at building skills, attitudes and values to shape a sustainable future. The vision is to create an informed society by nurturing sustainability ideas within young minds in schools. The Core objectives of Wipro "Earthian" are -

Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology in 2016 initiated to take the "Earthian" awards to schools in Arunachal Pradesh in collaboration with Wipro. In the first year itself the lone project submitted from Arunachal Pradesh by the group of students of King Cup School, Itanagar had made it to the top selected schools and won the prestigious award.

Continuing the winning trend consecutively for the 2nd year, the project submitted by group of students of Govt. Higher Secondary School, Doimukh on the theme "Biodiversity Conservation" made a place in the list of top 10 selected schools and won the Earthian. The award involves Rs. 1,00,000/- (Rupees One Lakh) only along with citation to the school and certificates to the participating student and guide teachers. The prizes were to be conferred in the Earthian Awards Programme to be organized w.e.f 3rd - 4th February, 2018 at the Wipro Corporate Office, Bangalore.

B. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME / PROJECT TAKEN UP BY APSCS&T DURING THE YEAR.


1. SETTING UP OF RURAL APPROPRIATE TECHNOLOGY DEMONSTRATION CENTRE (RTDC) IN ARUNACHAL PRADESH

The proposal for Setting up of Rural Appropriate Technology Demonstration Centre (RTDC) in Arunachal Pradesh was taken up by Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology (APSCS&T), Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh with Department of Science and Technology Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India during December, 2016. The project has been sanctioned by DST, GOI in March, 2018 with the following objectives;

- To develop it as a people's institution for motivating and creating social awakening among the village community, build up awareness, make them responsible for their own development and enhance their ability to accept the input of science and technology.
- To introduce innovative scientific and technological component, ideas accessible to the village community and enable the villagers to acquire knowledge and information through training and demonstrations and develop their skills for initiating income generating activities for creating sustainable livelihood.
- To adopt, demonstrate various rural technologies developed by different organizations, research institutions and to impart training to villagers using the trained manpower for their skill and technological advancement.
- To help the village community and cater proper societal development avenues programme by establishing linkage with various rural development agencies for socio-economic development of the villagers.
- To give necessary guidance and information, and counsel the people regarding the proven, innovative, cost effective and appropriate technological options and transfer these technologies for application.
- To enhance confidence and capability of the rural people by involving them in microlevel planning and providing central facilities for managing and processing of the locally available natural resources for its value addition.
- Up-gradation of indigenous traditional technologies and skills for utilization of available resources for improving the quality of life of the economically weaker sections of the society and providing scopes for starting entrepreneurial ventures.

So far the progress made all through 2018 - March' 2019 after the project was sanctioned by DST on 23rd march 2018 is commendable.

- **1.** Survey of site for setting up of training centre cum office for RTDC at Kimin was inspected by Project officers and Engineers on 17th April'2018. Building space of 50 mtr X 12.30 mtr from the existing DBT block has been decided to spare for setting up of various unit of RTDC at Kimin.
- **2.** A team of experts from CSIR-NEIST, Jorhat, Assam visited the project site on 9th June'2018 and finalized the layout of Distillation Unit of Citronella & Lemon grass; Vermicomposting Unit & Area for nursery of Citronella & Lemon grass is marked.

- **4.** On 20th Sept'2018, a team of experts from CSIR-NEIST, Jorhat visited the project site for second time and layout work for setting up of Mushroom production unit, Banana fibre extraction pad has been done during their visit which was attended by Director cum member secretary, APSCS&T and projects engineers.
- **5.** Vide clause 4 above the establishment of separate compartment for the mushroom production unit by particle board and glass partition work, its outdoor nursery shade, fitting of water basin, etc. & necessary electrical and water supply work have been completed.

6. Construction of Mushroom production unit which includes a 3 room laboratory has been completed. A Mushroom cultivation unit has also been constructed.

7. On 17th December, 2018, two machineries viz. "Air compressor 1.5 HP and Hand cum Motor operated Chaff cutter" for TP-16 Bio-fertilizer and Mushroom cultivation respectively, have been received from CSIR-NEIST's supplier at RTDC, Kimin.

2. SETTING UP OF SPACE EDUCATION CENTRE AND INNOVATION HUB AT ARUNACHAL PRADESH



Space Education Centre and Innovation Hub at Arunachal Pradesh Science Centre was dedicated to the people of Arunachal Pradesh and inaugurated on 8th December 2018 by Shri Nabam Rebia, Hon'ble Minister Environment & Forest, SWETA etc. Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh in presence Mr S. M. Khened, Director Nehru Science Centre, Mumbai, Er. Gaken Ete, the then Secretary, Science and Technology and Shri Bamang Mangha, Chairman, APSCS&T. The planetarium of this center simulates the night sky of Itanagar or any other place in the northern hemisphere. One learns to identify stars and constellations easily wherein the real sky no longer remains an enigma thereafter.

3. ESTABLISHMENT OF CENTRE FOR BIO-RESOURCES AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IN ARUNACHAL PRADESH AS A CENTRE OF EXCELLENCE (COE).

The proposal for establishing a Centre for Bio resources and Sustainable Development in Arunachal Pradesh was taken up by Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology (APSCS&T), Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh with Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Ministry of Science & Technology, Government of India in December, 2016 with the mission for "Development of Bio-Resources and their sustainable utilization through biotechnological interventions for socio-economic growth in Arunachal Pradesh."

Objectives:

- To set up state-of-art biotechnology research facilities at Arunachal Pradesh for work on sustainable development of bio-resources, using tools of modern biology,
- To study and document the unique biodiversity and bio-resources of Arunachal Pradesh.
- To undertake biotechnological interventions for sustainable development and utilization of bio resources of Arunachal Pradesh.
- To generate technological packages for employment generation and economic progress of the state in particular.
- To undertake capacity building (human resource development) for conservation of bio-Resources, development and utilization.
- To collaborate with other institutions/organisations/universities regionally/nationally for further research pursuits in bio-resources.



Land measuring an area of 29,306 Sq. Mts. has been made available by Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science & Technology at Kimin, Papum Pare District for establishing the Centre for Bio-Resources and Sustainable Development. The project has been sanctioned by Department of Biotechnology, Government of India during March, 2018 and the first installment of the grant has been released and received. The site development works have been completed, construction of the main building of the Centre is under progress, which is being carried out by state Public Work Department (PWD), Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh.

To start the activities of the center, temporary infrastructure has been developed by renovating the half-completed structure available at the Kimin project site. Office, laboratory with minimum required facilities has been set up for carrying out the primary experiments as well as the sample preparations. The center has been operating in its permanent campus at Kimin from the makeshift temporary infrastructure with effect from 1st October, 2018. DG set of 200 KVA capacities; office furniture's, equipment etc. have been procured, installed for smooth running of the temporary setup. Construction works of the permanent, main building is progressing well and the same is expected to be completed by March, 2020. The following are the progress made during the last one year;

- Recruitment processes and development of temporary infrastructure for operating the
 activities of the centre has been completed and the construction of the main building is
 going on and progressing as envisaged.
- Scientists in two batches were deputed who had undergone a Technical Training of 15
 Days on various aspects of Bio-Technology and Tools at CSIR- NBRI, Lucknow and NIPGR,
 New Delhi.
- Extensive field survey has been carried out in different parts of the state to gain the
 traditional knowledge of different tribes. The field survey resulted in finding of various
 important medicninal plants used by the traditional and local healers from Pasighat,
 Yazali, Sela, Kra Dadi. Through the field survey 35 alpine species from Arunachal Pradesh
 have been enlisted among which 8 taxa seems to be new records for Arunachal Pradesh.
- Few unexplored wild and edible species of plants with ethno-medicinal importance were selected for nutritional profiling and phytochemical characterization.
- Soil nutrient profiling of the agricultural field of Kimin area has been undertaken. Study was also done to identify beneficial bacterial diversity from undisturbed soil of Kimin along with In Vitro screening of the beneficial microbial strains for plant growth .The bacterial isolates of the alpine areas of the state have been identified using the 16srDNA techniques .Phylogenetic construction of the isolates has found it similar to important psychrophilic microbes recorded from Himalayan glacial regions.
- Database preparation of the traditional knowledge of the state is undertaken with the help of Bio-informatics tools.

4. SANITARY NAPKIN PRODUCTION AND TRAINING FOR SELF SUSTAINABILITY FOR RURAL TRIBAL WOMEN OF ARUNACHAL PRADESH

BACKGROUND:

Adolescence in girls signifies the transition from girlhood to womanhood. Good menstrual hygiene is crucial for the health, education and dignity of girls and women. A woman tends to plan her activities of daily life and in particular the outdoor activities and strenuous work in accordance with the monthly period. Thus, menstruation becomes a central issue in her life. Menstruation is an important sanitation issue but it is still clouded by taboos, myths and socio-cultural restrictions resulting in adolescent girls remaining ignorant of the scientific facts and hygiene health practices, which sometimes result into adverse health outcomes.

Menstruation is still regarded as something unclean and dirty in Indian society. Stigmas prevent mothers from demystifying menstruation to their daughters. As a result in most of the cases in the rural areas the first menarche (menstruation) often comes as a shock filled with fear, confusion and anxiety for the girls. Such fears need to be tactfully dispelled from their minds for healthy living. Due to lack of knowledge, unavailability of sanitary pads, high prices of those pads restrict girls from learning about their own bodies related to menstruation. Menstruation in tribal society is tagged as a "shame" or "bad omen". Menstrual blood is considered as unclean and impure due to the limited or no knowledge on menstruation. In order for women and girls to live healthy, productive and dignified lives there is a need to provide healthy family education and awareness to both the sexes. Empowering women and vulnerable girls is necessary so that their voices are heard and their menstrual health is taken into account. Hence, they will be provided with training in the production and marketing of low cost sanitary napkins by setting up sustainable processing unit. Considering the importance of the issue, the project Sanitary Napkin Production and Training for Self sustainability for Rural Tribal Women of Arunachal Pradesh was initiated by Arunachal Pradesh State Council for Science and Technology in 2016 in collaboration with Priyanshi Educational Cultural and Social Society, Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh to provide employable and skilled vocational training for the production of Sanitary Napkins (through handmade machines) to the tribal women in order to make them successful entrepreneurs for the production and sale of sanitary napkins. The project was successfully completed on 23.10.2019.

OBJECTIVES:

- i) To provide employable and skilled vocational training for the production of Sanitary Napkins (through handmade machines) to the tribal women.
- ii) To prepare the beneficiaries as successful entrepreneurs for the production and sale of sanitary napkins.
- iii) Production of Eco-friendly, biodegradable and low cost napkins easily affordable by all rural women.
- iv) Motivating them to get into business with business ideas;
- v) Developing personality of the beneficiary entrepreneurs;
- vi) To create awareness about the importance of menstruation and menstrual hygiene.
- vii) To dispel the beliefs, myths, misconception, taboos and stigmas associated with menstruation.
- viii) To encourage rural women to discard the use of cloth rags with affordable sanitary pads.
- ix) To tackle gender inequalities through rural women empowerment by training them in producing and marketing of low cost sanitary napkins

Under the project various Training and workshops were conducted and organized during the year 2018-2019, w.e.f 23rd May 2018 to 11th November 2018 at Papum pare and Namsai Districts of Arunachal Pradesh. The programme was organized in collaboration with PECSS, Bhopal. (Madhya Pradesh) and KTNWS, Namsai.

5. ESTABLISHMENT OF CHILDREN'S SCIENCE PARK AT KIMIN, PAPUM PARE DISTRICT, ARUNACHAL PRADESH





Children Science Park developed by A.P State Council for Science and Technology at Govt. Higher Secondary School, Kimin was inaugurated by Shri Bamang Mangha Chairman, A.P State Council for Science and Technology in presence of Shri Likha Teji (APPSC) Sub Divisional Officer, Kimin as special guest on 9th November 2018. The park is dedicated to the students of Kimin.

A science park is a cluster of interactive open-air play systems designed to fetch knowledge in basic science facts and phenomenon. In a world dominated by Science and technology, Science communication and Popularization is of utmost importance especially for our state where a large population needs to be told about the impact of science and technology in their daily lives.

6. DEMONSTRATION OF THE TECHNOLOGY ON GEO-THERMAL ENERGY FOR HEATING AND COOLING SYSTEM AT GENERAL HOSPITAL, KIMIN, PAPUMPARE DISTRICT OF ARUNACHAL PRADESH.

Ground Source Heat Pump (GSHP) systems, also referred to as Geo-Thermal heat-pump or geo-exchange systems, are electrically powered space heating and cooling technologies that take advantage of the earth's (or surface water's) relatively constant temperature below certain depths, to provide building space conditioning. The sub-surface is a source of heat in the winter and an efficient heat-rejection medium in the summer.) GSHP systems are clean (there are no on-site greenhouse gas emissions, because the systems do not combust any fuel), energy-efficient technologies that can effectively replace conventional heating and cooling technologies and improve building comfort. The primary benefit of installing a GSHP system is a reduction

in energy consumption and a resultant decrease in utility expenses. In terms of heating, GSHP with variable speed compressors can have a co-efficient performance of 6.0 or higher. The project was initiated in 2018 and it took 18 months for completion.

Objectives of the project:

- To carry out demonstration of heating & cooling system (geo-thermal technology) integrated with renewable energy system at Kimin General Hospital, Papumpare District, Arunachal Pradesh.
- To meet the energy requirements of the Kimin General Hospital.






