Armed forces told to forcefully deal with Chinese aggression along LAC

NEW DELHI, Jun 21: The armed forces deployed along the 3,500 km de-facto border with China have been given "full freedom" to give a "befitting" response to any Chinese mis-adventure, government sources said after Defence Minister Rajnath Singh reviewed the situation in east-ern Ladakh at a meeting with the top military brass

on Sunday.

The meeting was at-tended by Chief of Defence Staff Gen Bipin Rawat, Army Chief Gen MM Naravane, Navy Chief Ad-miral Karambir Singh and Air Chief Marshal RKS Bhadauria.

India has already

mobilised fighter jets and sent thousands of additional Army troops to for-ward locations along the border with China after 20 Indian Army personnel were killed in a brutal attack by Chinese troops in east-em Ladakh's Galwan Valley on June 15.

The clash in Galwan Val-ley, the worst cross-border violence in 45 years, signifi-cantly frayed ties between the two countries, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi sending a strong message to China that In-dia wants peace but if pro-voked, India is capable of giving a befitting reply. 
