3. Important policy decisions taken and major achievements during the month: (a) Important policy decisions taken during the month:

- 1. To hold department of Bio-technology sponsored Bussiness conclave meet of the finishing school programme in Arunachal Pradesh during Ist week of November 2025 at Itanagar.
- 2. Proposed to organise the Himalayan and North eastern states S&T councils conclave at Itanagar during last week of October 2025 as proposed by Secretary DST, New Delhi.

(b) Major Achievements during the month:

- 1. On 5th August, 2025, DBT–APSCS&T CoE for Bioresources and Sustainable Development, Kimin, signed a MoA with NESO Fugensus Pvt. Ltd. (Startup: NEORGANICS), RCC Building, T.T. Marg, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh. The startup is focused on advanced organic contract farming, agri-products, and value addition, with the aim of promoting a healthy lifestyle and organic products that benefit society while contributing to national development. This collaboration will support the CoE by providing opportunities for applied research, value addition, and technology validation, thereby strengthening its efforts in the commercialization of organic bioresources.
- 2. The Department of Biotechnology, Government of India, has approved and sanctioned the project proposal entitled "Promoting Integrated Beekeeping for Economic Upliftment of the ST (Rural) Population of Arunachal Pradesh", submitted by DBT-APSCS&T CoE for Bioresources and Sustainable Development, Kimin. The project has been submitted in technical collaboration with the CSIR-North East Institute of Science & Technology (NEIST), Jorhat, Assam.

In this regard, the first phase of discussions with CSIR-NEIST, Jorhat, was held on 27th August, 2025 at the Directorate Office, Itanagar. The meeting involved detailed deliberations on the objectives, scope of the project, along with a comprehensive review of the implementation plan. Key aspects such as cluster selection, training modules, timelines and technical support were thoroughly discussed to ensure effective execution and monitoring of the project. The collaborative discussion also aimed to identify potential challenges and strategies for capacity building, stakeholder engagement and community participation for the successful implementation of the project.

As part of the field activities, Scientific teams from the CoE conducted field survey to various districts of Arunachal Pradesh in August, 2025;

- A team of scientists and research officers of CoE, Kimin visited Namsai, Pasighat (East Siang District), and Dambuk (Lower Dibang Valley) from 1st to 3rd August, 2025 to identify prospective honeybee keepers and farmers.
- Dr. Debajit Mahanta, Joint Director, APSCS&T & Project Director, CoE, Kimin along with a team of scientists, visited Ziro (Lower Subansiri District) from 5th to 6th August, 2025 and conducted field surveys and discussions on the formation of suitable farmer clusters.
- Dr. Debajit Mahanta, Joint Director, APSCS&T & Project Director, CoE, visited Shergaon (West Kameng District) from 29th August to 1st September, 2025 to conduct field surveys and discussions for cluster formation for project implementation.
